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Instructional Objectives And Activities

Instructional objectives are often either ignored (by both teachers and students) or are, at best, occasionally referred to. However, it can be argued that instructional objectives should guide the teaching and learning process from beginning to end. Most lesson plan forms include a place for the objectives of the lesson to be recorded.

Instructional Objectives - Characteristics of a Well ...

Instructional objectives, also called behavioral objectives or learning objectives, are a requirements for high-quality development of instruction. They help you identify critical and non-critical instructional elements. They help remove your subjectivity from the instruction. They help you

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design a series of interrelated instructional topics.

Alignment of Instructional Objectives

Instructional objectives make definite the direction in which teaching leads and become the focus of instruction, not only for the teachers, but also for the students.
